<p><input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Language Requirement: language of teaching at the Instituto Piaget is Portuguese.</p> <p>The minimum recommended level (not mandatory) for study exchange/mobility purposes is A2 (no certificate required). Students can alternatively present knowledge of English, level B1. The evaluation moments can be carried out in English.</p>	

For the purposes of **Traineeship Erasmus mobility in the health areas, knowledge of the Portuguese language, level B1, is highly recommended**. Students will have to establish contact/provide treatments to patients who do not speak English in the internship.

Institution Grading System: Marks are based on a numeric qualification from a minimum of 0 to a maximum of 20 points achieved by the student according to the following scheme:
